COMMON WATERHEMP

Life Cycle: Annual with both male and

female plants

Reproduction: Female plants will produce

seed for reproduction.

Distinguishing Characteristics:

- Often confused with red-root or green pigweed at early stages of growth. It is distinguished by its:
- Narrow leaves, about 1/3 the width of redroot & green pigweed.
- 2. Wavy leaf margins.
- 3. Near hairless leaves and stems with a "smooth to the touch" feel.
- At maturity, waterhemp is considerable taller than other pigweeds ranging anywhere from 1.5-2.5 m (4.5'-7.5') in height. It will be very tall and narrow in appearance with stem colours ranging from green to red/purple.




